

Pink Ribbon Jax and Baptist Health are providing 2,500 no-cost mammograms to qualified community members

At Baptist Health, we understand the importance of early detection and screening of breast cancer. When breast cancer is caught early before it has spread, the five-year survival rate for this disease is between 95-99%.

We recognize that getting an annual mammogram might not be easy if you can't afford it.

That's why we are so grateful for the generous donation of Pink Ribbon Jax, a nonprofit that supports local breast cancer research, mammography and patient services at local hospitals. Pink Ribbon Jax has donated 2,500 no-cost mammograms at Baptist Health for qualified community members.

How can I qualify for a no-cost mammogram?

To qualify for an appointment, you must:

- Be uninsured
- Have an order from a primary care provider
- Be 40 or older
 - If you are age 30 39 and have a family member who was diagnosed with breast cancer before age 50, then the "10-year rule" applies. For example, with a first-degree relative diagnosed at age 42, your eligibility begins at age 32.

What if I don't have a primary care provider?

If you are uninsured and need a primary care provider, please reach out to the following health care centers in your community:

What steps should I take to schedule a no-cost mammogram?

- 1. Schedule an appointment with a clinic listed above or your primary care physician to get a physician's order for a screening mammogram.
